### Philosophy of Discipline

As a PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) School, we believe that all children can exhibit appropriate behavior when those behaviors have been explicitly taught. As a building we have set common expectations for our building, and teachers explicitly teach, model, reteach, and reinforce those expectations. We believe in being proactive and preventative through early intervention. We believe in differentiating our interventions based on students' needs.

## Student Evaluation

Student progress in Kindergarten through Grade Two is evaluated in terms of grade level objectives and teacher observations. Screeners and Benchmark Assessments are administered to students 3 times a year and measure students' progress in reading and math. We use Standards Based Reporting for our progress reports.
