ART

5th Grade Art:

Students are in the middle of finishing their first, large project: a self-portrait. Students are beginning to use the language of the classroom, and are sharing how their works reflect one style or another. Once the portraits are complete, they will be displayed for a short while and then students may take their artworks home.

Here is a tip, and a request, to help promote an academic conversation surrounding their work: Ask them questions about their artwork and hang their work up (temporarily or permanently). This helps develop pride in their work, show them how their persistence and effort is seen and appreciated by others, and to help show the importance of visual arts. Some questions you can ask: 1. What was the project about? 2. Can you tell me about your experience making it? 3. What style of portraiture did you choose? 4. What are you proud of?

6th Grade 3D/2D:

Students finished their first, major project! We are transitioning away from the theme of "identity" to guide us, and are moving to a new concept: sculpture. We will be moving quicker through the rest of the quarter, starting with toilet paper sculptures. Students will need one, new roll of toilet paper. Through toilet paper sculptures, we will learn about pop art, common themes seen through the movement, and will allow us a chance to practice form-making before the clay unit.

6th Grade Paint/Draw:

Gem painting is coming to a close! The project title is "My Many Facets," addressing ourselves as prized and precious creations much like gems. Students developed their painting technique, worked to create tints and shades on their own, applied the pigments in a way to recreate reality and create the illusion of form, and finally did a questionnaire about their own "facets." We will end the unit addressing how we can take artwork with seemingly little depth, and try to understand it beyond its surface.

Students will also get a chance to read the feedback they received from their classmates over their artwork, as we did peer critiques and not all students read their feedback.

Once our conversations are over, the students will learn to work with chalk, charcoal, and construction paper crayons/colored pencils to replicate reality; Still life drawings will be created. Learning about proper observational techniques and techniques for the mediums will help them be successful. This project should be about two weeks long. If your child has an aversion to chalk or charcoal, please let me know via e-mail.

Art Club: The art club schedule is made up and will be followed as closely as possible. The descriptions for each week will be communicated to students the week prior, so they can prepare for that schedule. Vehicles for pick-up should be in the **bus** line at 4:20 pm so that students may be prepared to leave the building at **4:30** pm. If your student shares that you are expecting to pick them up at the front, they will wait with the rest of the students on the other side of the building until pick-ups in the correct location have been addressed.

Computer

Computer Club Sponsor: Miss Greve

The Computer Club will be held in Ms. Greve's computer lab. All students are welcome. Some activities will be creating videos, using green screens, coding, and creating fun digital puzzles. Students are also welcome to work independently to finish digital projects for any PHIS class. Students need to be picked up at the front of the school by the flagpole.

5th Grade:

Students are in the middle of the Google Docs unit. They have learned various ways to move around a document, cut and paste text, as well as select text and format text. Next students will learn to add word art, images, tables and bulleted lists.

If a student is absent or needs additional time to complete any assignment, students are encouraged to attend the computer club. This is an excellent opportunity to get tutoring or practice computer skills. But if the student cannot attend the computer club, there is a video explaining the skills for each assignment in the Google classroom. The video will demonstrate each of the computer skills required to complete the assignment. Absent students are responsible for completing any missed assignments. Due to the nature of the class, there will not be time during class to make up missed work.

6th Grade Computer Applications:

Students spent October learning about social media. They concluded the unit by creating an interactive slide presentation about the consequences of posting inappropriate things on social media.

Next will be a short unit on Google Sheets. Students will learn to create some basic formulas to solve math problems, as well as how to create and format charts from data. Once they have the basics down, they will put their Google Sheets knowledge into practice by conducting a research project about cars. Following the steps of the scientific method, each student will create a short

report. After researching national trends about cars, they will create a hypothesis about what they believe they will find in our PHIS parking lot. Then the class will go outside to collect data from the school parking lot. Next, the students will enter their data into a Google sheet and create a chart that explains the findings of the data. Was their hypothesis correct? The data will tell.

REMEMBER: If a student is absent or needs additional time to complete any assignment, students are encouraged to attend the computer club. This is an excellent opportunity to get tutoring or practice computer skills. But if the student cannot attend the computer club, there is a video explaining the skills for each assignment in the Google classroom. Absent students are responsible for completing any missed assignments. Due to the nature of the class, there will not be time during class to make up missed work during class.

6th Grade PHIS Broadcast News:

Students have been busy creating special reports to add to the weekly announcements. The month of October was filled with stories about Halloween, and Autumn. Even the video jokes and the words of the week were autumn based. It is great to see the creativity of the students.

Now that November is here, the focus will be on Thanksgiving and more fall happenings. Your child will create 2 short videos about Thanksgiving (trivia facts and personal traditions) which might be used in the announcements. More jokes will be created, as well as words of the week videos. The videos created might be selected to be part of the Wednesday announcements. Additionally, students will continue to share their technology skills by creating "tech tip" videos. Students from all three 6th grade teams are rotating to take on the role of anchor.

Each term, students will create special videos. Some of these video reports will become part of the Wednesday announcements. For example, all students recorded an interview with an adult about a job. They also created a special report about a fall event. During term 2, students will pick a country and research how Christmas is celebrated in that country. This information will be used to create a "Christmas Around the World" video that may be used in the weekly announcements beginning in December.
