## **5th Grade Art:**

The end is near! We will use our last class periods to complete one painting, have one more work day, and end with a cleaning day. The last artwork, the painting, will offer students a chance to use unique painting techniques (wet-in-wet, tapping, acrylic paints vs watercolor paints, and the use of salt).

## 6th Grade 3D/2D:

Clay projects are done! It is time to fire the clay, then we will glaze the work. While we wait on the clay to dry, we will transition to learning about the "sgraffito" method for decorative application to clay. This will be done through DIY scratch art. During the last class period, students will take their artwork home and help clean up the room.

## **6th Grade Paint/Draw:**

Painting and Drawing students are wrapping up their observational drawings. If time allows, we will look at the concept of "emphasis" in art by making a unique piece showcasing the contrast of color and pencil shading (as we've practiced during the school year).
