

Pleasant Hill High School Wrestling 1986-1996 Era
Coached by Steve Leslie, the Pleasant Hill High School
wrestling teams emerged as one of the state's most
competitive from 1986 to 1996 in Class 1-2. The
Roosters earned nine top-four finishes in that span,
winning state championships in 1989 and 1996. They
were the runner-up in 1986, 1988 and 1995, and placed
third in 1987 and 1994. Pleasant Hill placed fourth in

Board of Education Update

In the November meeting, Dr. Paul Canaan presented the PHHS Theater group to the Board. The theater department just finished their production of the musical "BIG." Over fifty students from the

Intermediate, Middle, and High Schools were part of the performance. Several students presented a short skit from the show for the Board.

Sherry Helus presented Sara Adams, Primary School Title 1 Teacher to the Board. Sara has been working on ways to meet tutoring needs of the students at the Primary School. Sara and her team have created a process to provide additional support to the students that may need it. The Primary School staff works hard to help provide this support to their students.

Katie Shrader from the Cass County Health Foundation presented to the Board an overview of the Dental Screening Program that is provided to the Pleasant Hill School District. The Dental program is offered to students in grades K-6.

The Board approved the updated Exempt/Non-Exempt Classified Compensation Schedule that will take effect January 1, 2024.

Jim Schlichting and a representative from ADS shared a presentation for upgraded cameras at Eklund Field.

Dr. Suzanne Brennaman presented the principals from each building to share their building's MAP data for the 2023 school year. The data shared showed a comparison of results from the 2022 and 2023 school year vs. the state average in ELA and Math.


