


Thank you to the Pleasant Hill Fire Department for visiting the Primary School for Fire Prevention Month! The kids loved it!




We opened a post office at the Primary School to encourage students to write. Students were excited to start mailing letters to friends and staff in other classrooms.







work!












5th graders traveled to Powell Gardens. A great time was had by all!!






















6th grade students at PHIS created artwork centered around their identity, using the game "Tetris" to inspire and guide their works.

Parents as Teachers


