Dr. Michael Weishaar presented to the board an update on the Medical Broker interview process and the recommendation for IMA to assume contract/rates through June 30, 2026, The new rates per the IMA contract will begin on July 1, 2026.

The Board approved moving the November Board Meeting from November 18th to Thursday, November 20th at 6:15 pm.

DLR and Newkirk Novak provided an update on the Bond renovations for the district.
