Attendance

Since the Summer School program covers a great deal of material in a short amount of time, punctuality and perfect attendance are expected. **A high school student who is enrolled in credit recovery Launch Courses must attend consecutive days until the courses are complete. A lack of attendance or adequate progress can cause them to be dropped from the courses.** Required middle school students cannot miss more than one day or they risk not being promoted to the next grade level.

Enrollment Eligibility

Summer School classes will be prioritized for students who attend **Pleasant Hill School District**. Students will enroll through Focus.

Transportation

Transportation will be provided to students who reside in the Pleasant Hill R-III School District and complete the link above. **All transportation requests must be received by Monday, May 11, 2026, or district-provided transportation is not guaranteed.**

Student Conduct/Dress

All school conduct codes for the regular school year are in effect during summer school. Dismissal from summer school based on these codes is the decision of the Summer School Administration. Students are expected to behave in a manner that does not disrupt the learning process. Summer school is an optional program; therefore, behavior infractions will not be tolerated. **Students who engage in inappropriate conduct may be removed from the summer school program by the administration.**

Course Offerings Middle School (6th-9th)

No School on Friday, June 19

Please choose courses according to 2026-2027 grade levels.

Recovery 6th-9th

Duration: May 28-June 24

6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th grade recovery classes are recommended by staff at the current school. Students will be enrolled in Math and ELA, along with four other courses that support student learning. Other students may take these courses as well.

Remedial Wheel 6th-9th

Duration: May 28-June 24

Middle School Medieval Times

An all encompassing endeavor for all students to study medieval times, understand structures, culture, buildings, and all things medieval. Students will read, compute, analyze, and digest what this time periods meant to humans and how it affects everyone today.

Famous Artist Emulation Painting

Students will study, read about, and reproduce famous artworks thinking about the history, style, and artistic technique that encompasses each work. The concept will be studio time for each artist, digging into and emulating these works in their own pen.

Robotics and More

Students will explore more ideas, techniques, and construction of robots and other machines in a continuation of work they do during the school year in robotics classes.

Media & Communications

This class introduces students to the basics of digital storytelling, journalism, and content creation. Students build skills in writing, design, photography, and multimedia production while creating projects like newsletters, videos, or social media content.

Enrichment 6th-9th

Summer Beat

This class is an introduction to the show choir world. The student will learn basic choreography skills, learn popular music, work on facial expression to convey the music and have opportunities for solo performances. The student will have performance opportunities during the four-week period. A field trip may be taken during the summer school time. The student will also have the opportunity to observe video of other national and regional show choirs. Movies pertaining to music and performance will be viewed during this class. Students typically purchase or provide a t-shirt for the performance.

Other Offerings

Middle School Lifetime Fitness

Duration: June 2-July 31

Days/times:

Mon, Tue, Thurs 6:00-7:30 PM

Location: MS weightroom

Students will learn about proper nutrition and fitness as well as be placed in a fitness program by the instructor. Lifetime Fitness will be held at Pleasant Hill R-III School facilities. Traditionally, students who would attend middle school next year attend in the evenings.

Students do not have to complete registration to attend this Middle School class.

This year's eighth-grade class needs to enroll in the high school version of Lifetime Fitness.

Course Offerings High School (9th-12th)

Recovery 9th-12th

Duration: 4 hours (7:50 AM-12:05 PM)

June 1-June 25

High school remedial classes are available for students who failed with a percentage of 40-59% either first or second semester. Students below a 40% must retake the course during the school year. Students will be able to recover four courses through summer school, a maximum of 2 units of credit.

Students will be placed in the appropriate course by staff prior to the beginning of summer school.

Chromebooks 9th-12th

If a student is enrolled in a class that requires a Chromebook, they will keep their assigned device for summer school. Chromebook check in will occur June 25, from 10 AM - noon, OR on the day their summer school class is completed.

Full Credit Online 9th-12th

Personal Finance and Health will be offered online this summer through Canvas, an online learning management system.

Personal Finance

This course introduces students to several aspects of financial responsibility, which will prepare them for living on their own. Emphasis will be on the components of income, managing one's money, using credit, personal spending, saving, and investing for the future.

Health

This course gives students a better awareness and a more up-to-date look at health and its importance to them as individuals. Some topics discussed are alcohol, drugs, first aid, safety, tobacco, bone and muscle structure, and mental health and wellness.

These courses are available to anyone grades 9-12 who attended PHHS during the 2025-2026 school year. However, preference will be given to upperclassmen.

The courses will run online from approximately May 28 through June 24.

Driver's Education June 1 - June 26

**6 hours driving instruction
6-12 hours as an observer**

Limited seats are available. There will be an initial meeting for all students enrolled in Driver's Education on Monday, June 1 at PHHS at 7:50 AM. Driving times will be arranged with the instructor during that meeting. **Students must be fifteen years old by June 1, 2026, to take this course.** If the student's birth date occurs after June 1, the student must take driver's education the following summer.

Transportation will not be provided for Driver's Education.

Lifetime Fitness

Duration: 2 hours

Agriculture Cooperative Summer School Duration: 8 hours class time plus record book (TBA by Mr. Burgin and/or Ms. Wingard)

Students can earn **1/2 unit credit for 160 hours** (148 clock hours and 12 classroom hours) or **1 credit for 308 hours** (296 clock hours and 12 classroom hours) working at their SAE program.
